## Kid chef really knows his stuff

Justin Miller, who holds the Guinness world records for youngest chef and youngest published chef, has been helping out in the kitchen for as long as he can remember.

When he was just 1 year old, Justin figured out how to put together a peanut butter and jelly sandwich by watching his mom. By the time he was 3, he knew he wanted to become a chef.

At age 7, Justin wrote and published a cookbook, which sold thousands of copies. That got the attention of Marriot International. The company hired Justin to help create a kids' menu for its worldwide chain of hotels.

Now a teen chef, Justin's advice for other kids who want to cook is to keep trying.

"At first, some of my recipes weren't too good, but, like anything, it takes time to get it right," Justin says.

That's a good recipe for serving God, too. There will be times when you'll make mistakes. But God is willing to forgive you and give you a fresh start. He loves you and wants to see you accomplish great things for Him.

As you grow, keep following God, talking to Him in prayer and reading His Word. That's the best recipe for success.
